Our Story

Eric, our beautiful 27-month-old baby boy, had not been feeling well for a couple of weeks. On January 27, 2004, we took him to Hasbro Children's Hospital in Providence, RI where he was diagnosed with Stage IV of the cancer Neuroblastoma. They told us that the cancer had started in his adrenal gland, but had spread to his liver, bone marrow, lymph nodes, and pelvic bones. Three days later, Eric started his first round of chemotherapy. He responded well at first, but after a few days, he began having trouble breathing. He was admitted to the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, where his lungs continued to get worse. The doctors determined that Eric had contracted the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), which infects the lungs and breathing passages. Because the chemo had affected his immune system, he could not combat the virus, and Eric lost his short battle on Valentine's Day, 2004. Our world was changed forever.

The Tomorrow Fund was there for us throughout the entire ordeal and afterward. The day after Eric was admitted to the hospital, a social worker came to our room to explain the organization's mission and told us that we were now a "Tomorrow Fund Family". He handed us a voucher for food and parking and said that someone would be visiting daily. During these weeks, The Tomorrow Fund not only helped financially, but provided a source of comfort and relief by answering questions about cancer, treatment, insurance, and how to explain the situation to Eric's older sisters. After Eric passed, The Tomorrow Fund continued to provide financial and emotional support, and we will be forever grateful. To pay it forward, we have been raising money and awareness for the past 19 years, and Donna now sits on the board of this amazing organization.

To date our golf tournament has raised over \$250,000 and we know that Eric is so proud of all of us. On behalf of the many families helped by The Tomorrow Fund, and in memory of our beloved Eric, we thank you for your kindness and generosity.

NEUROBLASTOMA

Neuroblastoma accounts for 14% of all cancers in children younger than five years of age. It is a solid tumor cancer that begins in the nerve tissue in the neck, abdomen, or pelvis, but usually originates in the abdomen in the tissue of the adrenal gland.

Nearly 70% of those children first diagnosed have disease that has already metastasized or spread to other parts of the body. The average age at diagnosis is two years old.

Prognosis of Neuroblastoma is dependent on age, stage of disease, and specific characteristics of the tumor. There is very little known about why Neuroblastoma occurs, or about what factors increase the risk for occurrence.
